School Success

The Data:

9% of Waterbury 9th graders get mostly A's on their report card.

18% of Waterbury 6th graders have skipped school two or more days in the last four weeks and/or has below a C average.

13% of Waterbury 6th and 9th grade girls get mostly A's on their report card.

4% of Waterbury youth with 0-10 Developmental Assets get mostly A's on their report card.

15% of Waterbury youth with 31-40 Developmental Assets get mostly A's on their report card.

Just 10 More

To help Waterbury youth develop Just 10 More Developmental Assets, you can:

- Talk to a young person about how subjects such as Language Arts and Writing are important in the job you do.
- Praise them for a job well done on their school work and encourage them to persevere when something is difficult by helping them break down the job into smaller tasks.
- Clearly communicate to young people that you value learning, that you think school is important, and you want and expect them to take it seriously.
- Stay in contact with your child's teachers. Don't wait for report cards to talk about their progress.
